School Profile 2016-2017

OAK HILL SCHOOL, located on a seventy-two acre hillside in Eugene, is an independent, nonsectarian, nonprofit, co-educational day school serving students in kindergarten through grade twelve. Founded in 1994 as a college preparatory institution, the school currently has an enrollment of 210 students with 55 in the high school. The student-faculty ratio in the Upper School is approximately 3:1. The average high school class has 10 students. As an academic environment that promotes cross-cultural interaction and understanding, the high school includes 16% international students (China, South Korea, and Mexico). Over 75% of OHS faculty have advanced degrees.

Oak Hill School's mission is to provide the best K-12 education, creating caring and responsible critical thinkers.

Accreditation: National Association of Independent Schools (NAIS), Northwest Association of Independent Schools (NWAIS) and AdvancED.

Admission: Selective process based on previous student records, teacher recommendations, entrance exam and personal interview.

HIGH SCHOOL CURRICULUM

Oak Hill's curriculum challenges students to become caring and responsible critical thinkers in all their academic classes. The school offers a total of 19 Advanced Placement courses on a rotating basis with 6-8 AP courses offered in a given year. A minimum of 70 hours of community service and leadership development are required for graduation.

Graduation Requirements (One year's work equals one credit):

Marking System: Grades (A through F) are reported two times a year. Grades are unweighted and Oak Hill does not give the grade of an A+. **Honor Societies:** Membership in the Collis-Quernus chapter of the National Honor Society requires a 3.67 GPA.

Rotating Advanced Placement: English Language and Composition, English Literature, Spanish Language, Spanish Literature, Mandarin, French, Calculus BC, Calculus AB, Statistics, U.S. History, European History, U.S. Government, World History, Human Geography, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Environmental Science, Art and Computer Science.

Electives: Visual Art, Fundamentals of Theater, Jazz Band, Intensive Theater, Rock Band, Yearbook, Debate, Topics in Computer Science, Software and Hardware, Sex Education, Life Skills, ACT/SAT/TOEFL Test Prep, Chinese Games, Comparative Religion, Gardening and Design Lab.

Sports. Boys and Girls Cross Country (Varsity and Middle), Girls Volleyball (Varsity and Middle), Boys Basketball (Middle, Varsity projected for 2017), Girls Basketball (JV and Middle), Debate (Varsity).

CLASS OF 2016

There were 13 graduating seniors in the Class of 2016. Oak Hill School does not rank its students. Since the school's founding in 1994, 99% of Oak Hill graduates have been accepted to college. The graduating class averaged an 1218 on the SAT (CR + M) and a 26 on the ACT. Seven of our last 31 seniors have scored over a 1350 SAT (CR + M) or a 31 on the ACT with a high score of 1600 (SAT CR + M).

HONORS AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS

National Merit Recognition: National Merit Finalists in 2015 and 2016. National Merit Commended student in 2015. The Class of 2017 had two students qualify for the National Merit competition.

Advanced Placement: In 2016, the College Board recognized six Oak Hill students as having earned AP Scholar Awards (including Honors and Distinction), one of which was a National AP Scholar. Eighty percent of students' scores on AP tests were passing (≥ 3).
